Any live tree cut in its entirety will not be picked up unless prior approval has been granted by the JIPSD Solid Waste Department.

Yard debris piles must not exceed 4 feet in height, 5 feet in width and 15 feet in length (*NOTE:* Tree stumps must not exceed 2000 pounds or they will not be picked up).
