## Important Notice to Residents

South Carolina State Law (23-47-60) requires that residents display the address of the dwelling so that it is visible from the street, using numbers at least three inches (3") high. Reflective numbers four inches (4") in height are recommended and encouraged. The Post Office also requires correct and easily readable numbers on the mailbox. This numbering system is essential for delivery of mail and for rapid dispatch of emergency aid including fire, police and EMS. Deep frying a turkey for Thanksgiving and the holiday season has gained popularity in the past several years. This method can be dangerous if the proper safety guidelines are not followed. Some important rules to remember are:

- Always use a turkey fryer outdoors (away from wooden decks and garages).
- Use the fryer on a flat surface to prevent tipping.
- Do not leave the oil unattended. It could overheat and catch fire.
- Do not overfill the fryer. The oil could spill onto the burner and spread the flames.
- Never put a frozen turkey into the hot oil.
- Never let children or pets near the fryer. The oil remains dangerously hot for hours after use.

The most important consideration is to follow the fryer manufacturer's recommendations. Practicing safety is a good way to ensure a Happy Holiday season for everyone. For more safety tips regarding deep fryers or other holiday items, contact the James Island PSD Fire Department at 795-2094.
