## HURRICANE SEASON IS OFFICIALLY HERE



The JIPSD wants you to start preparing now. The 2019 Atlantic hurricane season may see fewer storms and hurricanes than last year, but that doesn't necessarily mean it will be any less dangerous, according to an updated outlook from the [Colorado State University Tropical Meteorology Project](http://www.colostate.edu/~tropical/).

Make sure you have a plan in place, and begin stocking up now on non-perishables. We recommend having bottled water on hand in the event of a storm, so the sooner you stock up, the better off you will be. Have an emergency contact list in place, and let them know your plans in the event of the storm, so that family and friends are aware of where you are, and will have a means to locate you after the storm.

Stay informed through your local news and weather channels, and check back with the JIPSD for news about our operations as well. If in doubt as to whether you should evacuate during a storm or not, err on the side of caution, and leave! Stay safe this year!
