

**JAMES ISLAND PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT  
ORDINANCE NO. 2021-07**

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2019-003 AND ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES ADOPTING, UPDATING OR REAPPLYING THE COMMISSION RULES OF PROCEDURE

**WHEREAS**, the James Island Public Service District, South Carolina (the “*District*”) is a South Carolina special purpose district created pursuant to Act No. 498 of the Acts and Joint Resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina for the year 1961, as amended (the “*Enabling Act*”), for the purpose of providing fire, sewer and sanitation services within its service boundaries; and

**WHEREAS**, in keeping with the respective authorizations in the Enabling Act, the Commission is authorized to “make bylaws for the management and regulation of its affairs”; and

**WHEREAS**, the James Island Public Service District Commission (the “*Commission*”), as the governing body of the District, previously adopted, updated, and reapplied a set of bylaws referred to as the Commission Rules of Procedure, dated December 16, 2019, (the “*Commission Rules*”) through adoption of Ordinance 2019-003; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission intends to repeal the Commission Rules and all prior versions thereto and replace the Commission Rules with a new version of Commission bylaws to be adopted through Commission resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, should conflicts arrive between this and any preceding ordinances or resolutions, this ordinance shall prevail with respect to the conflicting sections.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED AND ORDAINED** by the James Island Public Service District Commission, in a meeting duly assembled this 25<sup>th</sup> day of October 2021, that the District hereby repeals Ordinance 2019-003 and all prior District ordinances adopting, updating or reapplying the Commission Rules of Procedure.

**Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become effective on November 22, 2021.
